#### Foreword


On March 18th, 1942, carpenters' hammers rang out the beginnings of a symphony of construction as the first building took shape on the projected scene of Camp Campbell.

Here, then, in pictures, is the miracle of Camp Campbell . . . the graphic story of a people fighting for the freedom of all peoples. . . .




GENERAL WILLIAM BOWEN CAMPBELL


