Here, then, in pictures, is the miracle of Camp Campbell . . . the graphic story of a people fighting for the freedom of all peoples. . . .

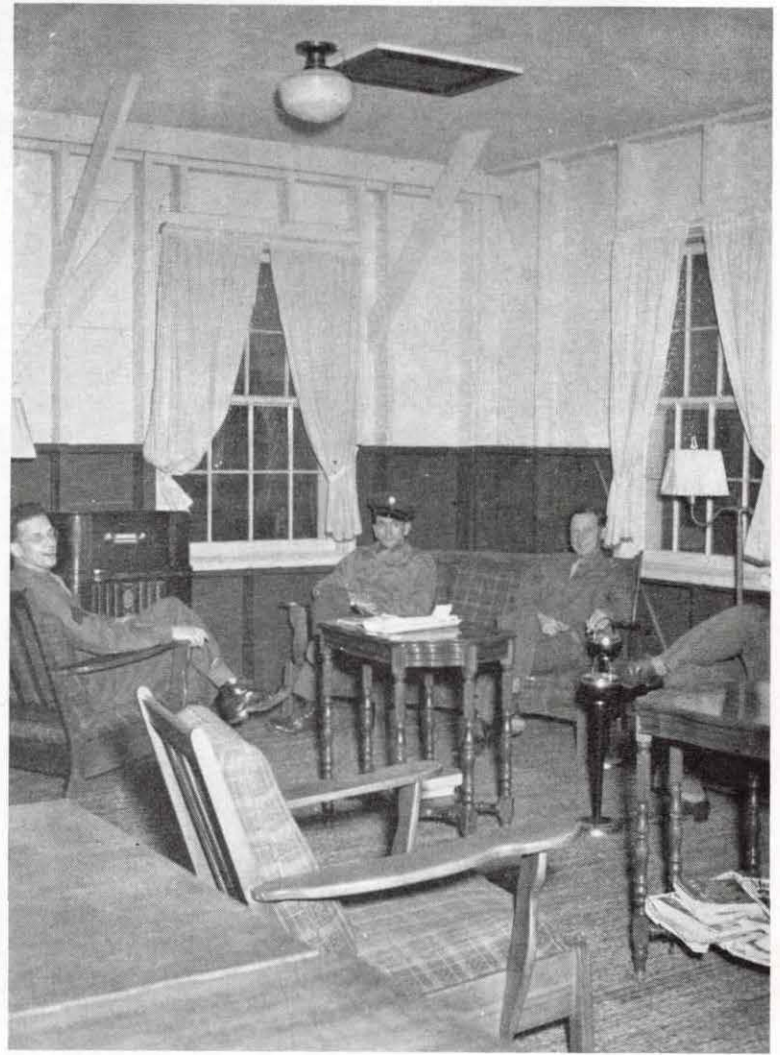
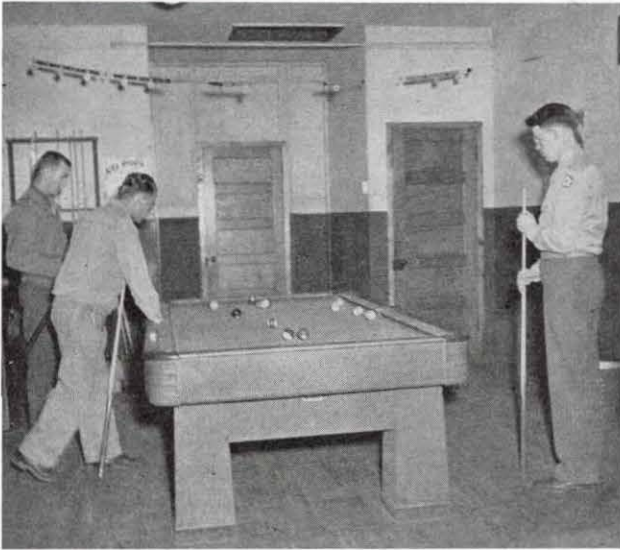




GENERAL WILLIAM BOWEN CAMPBELL
